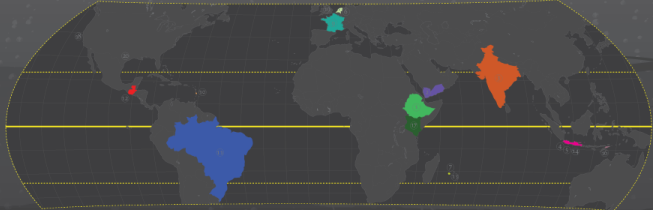


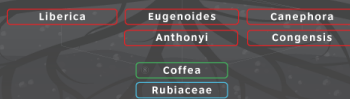
BRIEF HISTORY



- 1 1480s - Arabica coffee grown wild in Ethiopia/Sudan
- 2 1480s - Arabica coffee - Cultivation of coffee begins in Yemen
- 3 1490s - Coffee is introduced from Yemen and planted in Brazil by Portuguese explorer Paulo de Uzeira
- 4 1600s - Coffee is introduced to Indonesia from Yemen by the Dutch
- 5 1600s - First coffee harvest in Java
- 6 1600s - Arabica coffee plant from Yemen introduced to Dutch botanical garden
- 7 1680s - 1700s - Typica coffee introduced to the Americas (Guatemala)
- 8 1711 - Coffee is introduced to own botanical garden - Colombia
- 9 1714 - First coffee plant (the "Halle" tree) grown in the French West Indies (Martinique)
- 10 1721 - Typica introduced to Martinique by the French (Sikalang de Clavel)
- 11 1721 - Coffee is planted in Brazil
- 12 mid-to late 18th century - Coffee is planted in Mexico and South America
- 13 mid-19th century - Introduction of Typica from the Bourbon
- 14 1800s - 1850s - Coffee had not become Brazil's coffee production, Brazil's production increases
- 15 mid-to late 19th century - Brazilian coffee production increases from Java and South America, India
- 16 1800s - Naturally occurring interspecific hybrid of C. Arabica and C. Canephora discovered on Timor
- 17 1800s - 1850s - Most widely cultivated coffee plant (Robusta) introduced to Europe, Indonesia
- 18 1800s - Three "specialty coffees" selected by Luca Scazzano
- 19 1800s - French (Santal) and Dutch (Bourbon) introduce pure Arabica coffee to Indonesia
- 20 2010 - World Coffee Research releases first version of its Variety Catalog

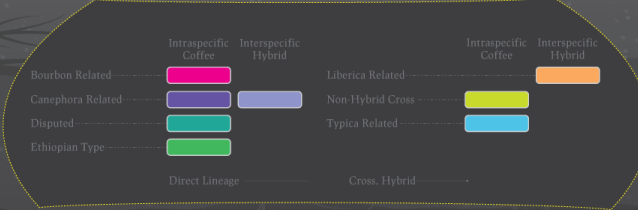
